

## **General Laborer - Job Description**

5+ years' experience working as a construction laborer preferred.

At the direction of the superintendent, clean up debris, trash and excess materials from the construction job site. OSHA 10 certification preferred or a willingness to obtain. The successful candidate must have a working knowledge of different types of carpentry tools and how to use them safely. e.g. Saws (Band, circular, jig, reciprocating, chop, compound miter, etc.), Drills (Electric, Cordless, Hammer, etc.), and cutting torches is required.
